Quick Checklist Before You Apply

Use this to narrow down your top picks. Don't skip the fine print — it can make or break your experience.

Accreditation & Recognition

- Is the school *regionally accredited*?
 - Is the degree recognized by employers in your field?
 - Does the school have a good reputation (check forums like Reddit or DegreeInfo)?
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Flexibility

- Are courses **asynchronous**, self-paced, or offered in short terms (e.g. 8-week blocks)?
 - Can you take classes on nights or weekends?
 - Are there **monthly start dates** or only fixed semesters?
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Affordability & Financial Aid

- What's the **tuition per credit hour**?
 - Are there **hidden fees** (tech fees, graduation, materials)?
 - Does the school accept **employer tuition assistance**?
 - Can you earn **credit for work experience** or previous courses?
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Support & Services

- Is there **24/7 tech support** or live academic help?
 - Do you get access to a **career advisor or resume help**?
 - Are there online tutoring or mentorship programs?
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Program Fit

- Does the school offer a degree in **your desired field** (e.g. healthcare, IT, business)?
 - Are the course topics practical and job-aligned?
 - Are the instructors industry professionals or just academic?
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Bonus Tips

- Google the school + “Reddit” or “Quora” and read real student experiences
 - Look up reviews on **College Confidential**, **Trustpilot**, or **DegreeInfo.com**
 - Ask: “Can I see myself finishing this with my current life schedule?”
